

How To:

Record your own VoiceOff files

It's quite easy to record your own audio for the VoiceOff unit. The only equipment you need is an audio recording device and a computer.



The VoiceOff only plays back audio files that are stored in the industry standard MP3 format, so you need to either record and save to this format or convert your sound file to an MP3. There are many free audio converting programs available online, so no hassle necessary!



Record & Save. Once you've recorded your sound/message (and saved them as MP3) you need to copy them to a SD card*. Most computers and laptops have a SD card slot, but if not we have a handy USB card reader in our collection (Code: COM500 see page 48). We recommend you use a second SD card just incase you need the original VoiceOff files on the SD card provided with the unit.



Rename. The audio files need to be in a folder called **SYSQ** and then renamed 0001 .mp3, 0002.mp3 etc. so that the VoiceOff knows which sound to trigger with which alarm input. This is printed on the inside of the VoiceOff lid for a quick reference.

And that's it! Simple and easy. Remember that we provide a wide range of pre-recorded voices and we also do bespoke recordings for that extra professional edge!
